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## ORDINANCE NO. 2023-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, 2 3 FLORIDA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2019-9 AS SET FORTH IN THE CITY'S 4 CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF SECTION 3 TO BE ENTITLED "ESSENTIAL FACILITIES AND SERVICES" ; PROVIDING FOR 5 6 **ESSENTIAL FACILITIES SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES;** 7 **PROVIDING FOR SCREENING AND BUFFERING; PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTIONS** 8 FROM PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SETBACK **REOUIREMENTS: PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION,** 9 PROVIDING FOR 10 **CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE** 11 DATE.

- 13 WHEREAS, the City Council finds it is in the public's interest to establish 14 policies and procedures to allow for consistent, flexible, creative, and 15 economically beneficial development within the City of Westlake.
- WHEREAS, on September 23, 2019, the City Council of the City of Westlake
  adopted Ordinance 2019-9 which established a zoning district and set forth
  standards for the zoning district;
- WHEREAS, the City's Planning Consultants recommend that the Code of Ordinances, specifically Ordinance 2019-9 be amended to create and establish regulations for essential facilities and structures.
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## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY FOR THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

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28 **SECTION 1**. <u>Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are confirmed, adopted and 29 incorporated herein and made a part hereof by this reference.

30 SECTION 2. The City Council hereby amends Ordinance No. 2019-9 by
 31 amending Article \_\_\_\_\_ by specifically creating Section 3 entitled "Essential Facilities
 32 and Services" as follows:

33 **Section 3: Essential Facilities and Services.** All buildings or structures defined 34 as essential facilities and services in Chapter 1, Article 1.2 of this code (the 35 "Essential Service Facilities"), are permitted by right in all zoning districts as 36 shown in Table 3-20, when necessary for the day-to-day operation of the 37 applicable governmental entity, subject to the requirements set forth in Chapter 3 38 Article 3.3 Section 3.

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DJ DOODY revised 3.28.23 915a 1 A) Height of structures. 2 No portion of any Essential Service Facility regulated by 3 this section shall exceed 50 feet in height in any 4 residential zoning districts or exceed 150 feet in non-5 residential zoning districts. 6 **B)** Screening and appearance. 7 Essential Service Facilities (excluding transmission 8 poles) exceeding three (3) feet in height, shall be of a 9 neutral, non-glare color or finish so as to make them 10 visually unobtrusive. In the event the Essential Service 11 Facilities are adjacent to property within a R-1 or R-2 12 zoning district, the Essential Service Facility shall provide 13 shrubs or plant material acceptable to the City at least 14 three (3) feet high at time of planting to shield the 15 Essential Service Facility from adjacent residential 16 properties.. 17 C) Exemptions from property development regulations. 18 (a) Essential Service Facilities shall be exempt from the 19 property development regulations which set forth minimum dimensions and setbacks, except as 20 21 provided below. 22 (b) Parcels containing Essential Service Facilities shall 23 not be required to meet the minimum required lot 24 area and lot dimensions for the zoning district 25 wherein located, provided that access, buffering, 26 drainage, retention, parking and other applicable 27 provisions of this section and the Land Development 28 Regulations are satisfied. Essential Service Facilities 29 shall not have a maximum lot coverage exceeding 30 75%, and shall provide for a minimum pervious 31 percentage of lot coverage of 25%.
